ODNB '... By the time of Trafalgar, however, Melville had left the Admiralty, the events which led to his impeachment being under way. They arose from legislation which he himself had passed in 1785 to sort out the chaotic finances of the navy. As its treasurer he failed, however, to follow his own regulations. This inconvenient fact now came to the notice of a commission of inquiry. It found out in particular that Melville had not, as required, kept at the Bank of England official disbursements allocated to him though not yet spent. Since he refused to co-operate in showing where else they had gone, the focus of the investigation switched to his subordinate, Alexander Trotter, paymaster of the navy. Trotter eventually admitted to having drawn money from the bank and laid it out in investments of his own, a practice by no means uncommon among public servants at the time, if in this case expressly prohibited by law. The commission's report came out in March 1805. While it stopped short of saying that Melville had lined his own pockets, it blamed him for what had been going on....'

Henderson had rare gifts as a lecturer, historian, and writer, and was also an able staff officer. He had a fascinating and pleasant personality. He has been described as the most scientific British strategist of his time; through his lectures and person he exerted a profound influence on young officers, and in that respect has been compared with Prussia's Helmuth von Moltke (1800–1891). By influencing Roberts's strategy in South Africa, Henderson helped shape the course of the war. He emphasized that the Boers were to be thoroughly defeated in the field, and that capturing their capitals would not end the war. After his return to England, this insight was lost, with detrimental effects for the British army in South Africa.'

His task was to carry construction of the railway, already built from Lagos to the Niger, into the north and up to Kano.
