The work's limitations drew lukewarm reviews, but its merits have since been increasingly appreciated. Nash suffered financial loss and even by 1799, when he published a long-promised supplement, at least 288 of the original 750 copies remained unsold. An Index was published by the Worcestershire Historical Society in 1894–5 ...'

The Société de Géographie, founded in 1821, is apparently the oldest society of its kind in the world. The journal is almost as old as the Society, the first issue was released in June 1822, but was interrupted from 1940 to 1946; thus it is only in its 168th year. It has had three successive names: From 1822 to 1899 inclusive, it was called 'Bulletin de la Société de Géographie' (Bulletin of the Society of Geography) and was issued monthly until 1882, when the original studies are grouped into booklets published quarterly and separated off are the Proceedings of Records enabling faster publication. The studies diversify somewhat with articles on natural sciences, particularly geology now included. From 1900 to 1939 inclusive, it was called La Géographie (Geography), the earlier title becoming its subtitle. It remained mostly monthly. From 1940 to 1946 inclusive, the journal ceased publication. In 1947, it was renamed 'Acta Geographica' and was issued quarterly. The purpose of the Bulletin was to document newly discovered geography of the world and monitor the work of travelers and explorers, encompassing a variety of topics: history, archeology, ethnography, alongside tales of travel and voyages. Various centenarians are commemorated as those of large families: Cook, Lapérouse, Entrecastreaux, Dumont D'Urville, Humboldt, and Christopher Columbus and Vasco da Gama. Few studies are actually in Europe, even rarer those concerning France. Attention is focused on all continents, particularly in Africa where Germans, English and French were collaborating on research sources and courses of the Niger, Congo and the Nile.

The Belgian Royal Society of Geography (SRBG) was conceived on 27 August 1876, under the name of Belgian Society of Geography, just days before the opening by King Leopold II of the Conference Geographical Brussels and a few months before the creation of the Geography Society of Antwerp. At

that time, under the influence of colonialism and trade, different parts of the world were the subject of intense interest.

In 1882, King Leopold II took the Society under his protection and authorized the introduction of the term "Royal" in its designation (first used in volume 7 1883). Thereafter, King Albert I participated in various meetings of the SRBG. Given his input, and the political climate at the time, much emphasis in the Bulletins is given to Africa, and in particular the establishment of The Congo Free State, as well as America, Asia, the Poles, Polynesia, Australasia, and Europe. With details of new publications, biographies, obituary notices, etc. Giving an insight into the role of Belgium throughout the world in this period, through the Belgium perspective, an immensely interesting series.

The Royal Geographical Society was founded on 24th May 1830 as an institution to promote the advancement of geographical science. Founded by seven members of the Raleigh Travellers's Club - a dining club which had met since 1826, its purpose was the 'advancement of geographical science'. The history of the society was closely allied for many of its earlier years with 'colonial' exploration in Africa, the Indian subcontinent, the polar regions and central Asia especially, enshrining such famous names as Livingstone, Stanley, Scott, Shackleton, Hunt and Hillary.
