*William Hutton (1723–1815), historian, who opened Birmingham's first circulating library in 1751. ODNB ‘... Written in 1780 and published in 1782 (though bearing the date 1781), [the above work] was his first book and the most successful, the most enduring, and, as later enlarged, the most substantial. ‘This was afterwards considered the best book I ever wrote. I considered it in a much less favourable light’ (Life, 196). One object in publishing it was to glorify the town and, for all its digressions and the sometimes ponderous humour of the author's asides, it presents a spirited portrait of a great commercial and industrial town in the most vigorous phase of its growth. William Withering, friend of Joseph Priestley, declared it the best topographical history he had ever seen.*

*William Lambard (1536–1601), antiquary and lawyer. ODNB ‘... It was on his marriage and move to the county, as he later explained to Sir Henry Sidney, that, having already collected some notes for a topographical dictionary, he conceived the novel idea of a systematic survey of Kent. What was in time intended as the first instalment of a historical topography of England was completed in draft in 1570, read in manuscript by Parker and Lord Burghley, and published as [the above] The earliest county history, based on wide and critical reading (partly informed by Lambarde's protestant suspicion of monks and their works), it draws also on Domesday Book and on royal charters, and includes in its climatic, economic, social, religious, and historical survey a short investigation of the see of Canterbury; a discussion of the local inheritance custom of gavelkind is appended. While Lambarde was uninterested in pre-Anglo-Saxon history (unlike William Camden) and exhibited no appreciation of landscape, his book ‘is packed with learned information’ and ‘eminently readable’ (McKisack, 137). The project to publish on other counties was eventually abandoned in 1585, when Lambarde learned of Camden's similar undertaking ...’*
